

## TRANSPORTATION, WAREHOUSING AND LOGISTICS

### **Program Overview**

The Warehousing and Distribution Program trains employees for work in the transportation, warehousing and logistics industry (TWL). MCC developed this certificate program in response to increased demand for this type of work as the marketplace grows globally.

The Workforce Boards of Metropolitan Chicago cite the TWL industry as the fifth largest employment sector in the region, and the sector continues to grow. The 2006-2016

State of Illinois Employment Projections (Long-Term) show warehousing and storage occupations are expected to increase 4.17% every year. The industry is worth \$8 billion to the Chicago region, employs over 120,000 people, and maintains a payroll in excess of \$3.2 billion.

Trained, career-oriented employees who can grow with the industry are the most marketable. MCC helps prepare students for entry-level warehousing opportunities—including order fillers, forklift operators, and shipping and receiving clerks—as well as for technical roles. Those looking to move into supervisory or management roles can also benefit from the MCC program.
