- You will need to apply for graduation and pay the graduation fee, at the beginning of your last semester at MCC, in the Registration Office. An official degree audit will follow.
- Also note that the acceptance of non-traditional credit (CLEP, AP, DANES, military service, proficiency exam) varies from institution to institution.
