### **Program Overview**

The Entrepreneurship Program is ideal for anyone involved in starting, owning, managing, expanding a business, or considering self employment. The courses present unique topics related to business ownership and small business operations. Courses also provide useful information and skill development to individuals who provide services to small businesses and business owners.

### **Why enroll?**

Owning or managing a small business requires unique skills that are different from being employed in larger businesses. Over 70 percent of successful business owners have taken courses and seminars in entrepreneurship. Ninety percent of failed business owners did not take advantage of courses and seminars. ## What can you gain?

The MCC certificate in Entrepreneurship offers some of the most comprehensive and convenient training in entrepreneurship in the state.
