Transfer guides are produced as a service to MCC students. Every effort is made to maintain up-to-date and accurate information; however, this information is subject to change. Such changes take precedence over the information on this guide. Students should check with an MCC advisor and the four-year school as soon as the transfer decision is made. Responsibility for complying with requirements ultimately rests with the student.

### I. Transfer Options

- A. A.A. or A.S. Degree
  - Judson strongly recommends the completion of an A.A. or an A.S. degree.
  - Lower division general education courses are considered complete, with following exceptions:
    - mission related courses in Old Testament Biblical studies(BST101), New Testament Biblical studies (BST102), upper division literature, and CRP481 Faith and Life;
    - specific general education courses stipulated by the major; and/or
    - professional certification requirements.
- B. Illinois Articulation Initiative – Judson University is an IAI participating institution. The IAI core must be completed by the time the student matriculates to Judson. The IAI core does not exempt students from mission related courses listed above.
- C. Students who transfer prior to completing an A.A. or an A.S. degree or the IAI core are required to complete Judson’s general education requirements. (refer to chart on this guide)

### II. Admission Information

- A. Students with fewer than 28 semester hours of transferable credit must meet freshman standards and will be eligible for admission consideration upon submission of the following:
  - A completed application for admission form
  - A non-refundable \$40 application fee
  - An official high school transcript or GED scores
  - Official ACT or SAT results
  - Official transcripts of all college level academic work (minimum 2.50 GPA)
- B. Students with at least 28 hours of transferable credit are eligible to be considered for admission upon submission of the following:
  - A completed application for admission form
  - A non-refundable \$40 application fee
  - Official transcripts of all college level academic work (minimum 2.0 GPA)
- C. Judson operates on a rolling admission basis, and applications are reviewed as they become complete.
- D. Admission GPA calculation – All college-level work is calculated into the admission GPA. For repeat courses, the course with the highest grade is used.
- E. A maximum number of 66 semester hours of community college coursework can apply toward Judson graduation requirements. Community college coursework cannot be used to satisfy upper-level requirements.
- F. A maximum of 8 semester hours of applied music and/or theatre may be transferred.
- G. A maximum of 8 semester hours of physical education activity courses may be transferred.
- H. To be admitted in good standing, the cumulative GPA must be 2.5 or higher.
- I. Grades below C- will not transfer. Completed IAI core will be honored. With the exception of Composition I & II, coursework with D grade will satisfy IAI general education at Judson as long as minimum admission GPA is satisfied. Please be aware that specific courses required for majors require a minimum of C- or better.

**III. Recommended courses for students transferring prior to AA/AS degree or IAI completion**

Use the following chart to select MCC courses that fulfill Judson College general education requirements.

Work closely with an MCC academic advisor to make sure course selections are appropriate for chosen major.
