**Admission Requirements**

- Submit completed university application to SIUC Admissions Office
- Submit Teacher Education Program (TEP) application to SIUC/UCLC Program Coordinator by **September 1** for a spring semester start or **February 1** or **June 1** for a fall semester start
- Submit evidence of passing the Illinois Test of Basic Skills with TEP application
- Completion of an AA or AS degree or a minimum of 45 credit hours of post secondary work in liberal arts and sciences
- Completion of ENG 151 and ENG 152 with the grade of “C” or better; completion of MAT 201 and MAT 202 with grade of “C” or better prior to enrolling; and EDU251 with grade of “C” or better prior to enrolling.
- If coursework not already completed, submit a plan for completing the required liberal arts and concentration courses to Lake County Coordinator by October 1 for spring semester start or March 1 for fall semester start (Lake County Coordinator will assist)
- 2.75 cumulative GPA (The program is selective. A 2.75 GPA does not guarantee admission.)

**Additional Information**

This is a two-year cohort program with 25 students admitted each semester. SIUC/UCLC offers 54 hours of professional coursework and 15 hours of electives toward completion of the 128-hour program. SIUC/UCLC coursework is taken on-site and is delivered in sequenced, semester-long blocks.

- Basic class schedule for the first 3 semesters (blocks) is (times may vary within blocks):
  - 4:30 pm – 9:30 pm Monday evenings
  - 8:00 am to 4:30 pm Saturdays
  - 1/2 day per week field work in an assigned elementary classroom
- Student teaching is scheduled for the final semester (block)
- 60 credit hours must be earned from a 4-year school (SIUC/UCLC offers 15 hours of electives, allowing students to earn all 60 credits with SIUC within the 2-year program.)
- Students must earn a grade of C or better in all coursework required as part of their certification program.
- SIUC core curriculum is satisfied with completion of AA degree, AS degree, or Illinois Articulation Initiative General Education Core Curriculum (IAI GECC). To satisfy Elementary Education requirements, the specific general core courses listed in the chart below must be included.

- For students without a completed AA degree, AS degree, or IAI GECC, the following courses are required in addition to those listed in the chart below:

INTEGRATIVE STUDIES

Diversity in the U.S. - select one course from following: ENG 275\*, HIS 170, MUS 154\*, PHI 158, 261\*, SOC 260, SPE 265, HIS 141

Interdisciplinary - select one course from following: GEG 101\*, 220\*; PHI 160\*; SOC101

\* May be used to satisfy only one requirement.
