I would like to request your assistance in obtaining a 2017-2018 school list, most preferably an electronic email list. I have attached my formal request to this email, along with a copy of the Solomon Act for your reference.</p> <p>My office typically will email the students once each semester to give them information on our officer program. We offer a non-committal, paid summer program in Quantico, VA for those qualified undergraduates that would like to explore the possibility of becoming a commissioned officer post college graduation. The program is called the Platoon Leaders Course (PLC), and it is the only military officer program offered to full time undergraduates as a voluntary and exploratory leadership experience. PLC is an non-binding alternative to the usual college ROTC program. However, if PLC students attend and complete the summer courses, they will be offered a military commission as a 2nd Lieutenant after graduation just the same as ROTC or the Naval Academy. The course goes for 6 or 10 weeks during their college summers, they are paid for their time and some of your schools will even offer college credits as well. It is an application and selection process, so it is very competitive just as many summer internships are. More information can be seen here: www.marines.com/officer.</p> <p>Our program is not widely known and we would like to spread the information to give interested students this unique opportunity. I would like to reiterate that my office will not solicit the students past a single email per semester. Although the Solomon Act requires address, phone numbers, etc., I do not intend to directly call or send mail to their home addresses. I simply would like to ask for emails addresses of only full time undergraduates that are U.S. citizens.</p> <p>Please contact me directly for any further information or questions.
