<p>Additional Information BGS Program</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students may transfer to the BGS program from MCC with an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree or Associate in Arts (AA)/Associate in Science (AS) degree. • A maximum of 80 community college credits can be applied toward meeting BGS degree requirements. • Credits may be earned through prior learning assessment, CLEP, ACT, PEP, DANTES, military training/service. • The program does not have a major, which allows students to develop an individualized curriculum based on their personal goals.
