The BS and MS in Nursing degree programs are accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

**Application and Admission Information**

- **Application** - The RN to BSN online option admits new students six times per year: January, March, May, July, September and November. Apply early to allow time for processing your application. Recommendation is to allow for a minimum of two weeks for processing. Apply online: <http://www.chamberlain.edu/admissions/undergraduate/rn-to-bsn/admission-requirements>
- **Admission Requirements**
  - Submit completed application and supporting documents, including official transcripts
  - Nursing diploma or Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN)
  - Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA from transcripts reviewed. Chamberlain uses transcribed GPA.
  - Current, active RN license in the U.S. or in a jurisdiction that is an associate member of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN); licensure must be maintained throughout the program of study

- **Additional Information**
  - **Transfer Credit Evaluation:** Refer to recommended courses on this guide for approved articulated coursework. Other courses will be evaluated on an individual basis. Transfer credit generally is not awarded for coursework taken at another institution after initial enrollment at Chamberlain.
  - **Minimum Grade:** A minimum grade of C is required for all transfer coursework.
  - **Number of Credits Accepted from MCC:** 77 semester hours toward the 122 needed to complete the BSN (agreement provides for 37 general education and 40 nursing proficiency credits); follow course recommendations outlined on this guide
  - **Proficiency Credit:** Credits may be recognized through nationally recognized tests such as AP, CLEP and DANTES. Military educational history also may be recognized for proficiency credit.
