Transfer Options

- **Completed Associate of Art or Associate of Science degree:** Students who have completed an Associate of Art or Associate of Science degree from MCC will meet the UW-Whitewater general education requirements. The Associate of Art or Associate of Science does **not** waive the **U.S. Racial/Ethnic Diversity** course requirement. Students may complete the U.S. Racial/Ethnic Diversity course after transferring to UW-W.
 - MCC Equivalents for the U.S. Racial/Ethnic Diversity course requirement:
 - ART 165, EDU 255 or SOC 260
- **IAI GECC:** Students may complete the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI). However, the completed IAI will not necessarily meet all college requirements and prerequisite coursework for UW-W.
- **Completing some courses at MCC:** Students will follow UW-W's general education requirements to meet the general education component of the baccalaureate degree.

Priority Deadlines:

- Fall-July 1st
- Spring-December 1st
- Students are encouraged to apply at least one semester prior to transfer term

Admission Requirements

- 2.00/4.00 GPA on a minimum of twelve transferable credits, using [UWW Repeat Policy](#).
- Students who do not have twelve transferable credits will be reviewed based on new freshman criteria.
- The maximum number of semester hours transferable from a community college is 72.
- Business, and Education majors at UWW may have higher GPA requirements for acceptance into the major. www.uww.edu/admissions/transfer

Calculation of Admission GPA

Grades from all transferable coursework will be used. Developmental coursework in English and Math are included. A repeated course grade will be used but only if the original grade is C- or lower. Please see the [UWW Repeat Policy](#) for more information regarding repeated courses.

Foreign Language Requirement

Foreign language is only required for students pursuing a Bachelor of Arts within the College of Letters and Sciences. Students that have completed at least 1 year of the same foreign language with a C or better from MCC have met this requirement. **Only college level foreign language is considered to fulfill this requirement.*

Scholarships

Student's application for admission also serves as the scholarship application. Students must be admitted by April 1st to be considered for scholarships for the next fall semester. Scholarship consideration is based on transfer GPA and credit amounts.

General Education Information

Students transferring **with** the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences Degree:

- University-wide general education courses are satisfied with completion of an Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences degree from McHenry County College with the exception of the U.S Ethnic/Diversity requirement.
- Students may complete the U.S. Racial/Ethnic Diversity course after transferring to UW-W. MCC equivalents for the U.S. Racial/Ethnic Diversity course requirement:
 - ART 165, EDU 255 or SOC 260

Students transferring **without** the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences Degree:

- **Applied Associate degrees do not waive students from general education requirements.**
- Students who do not earn the Associate of Arts or Associate of Sciences degree before transferring will need to complete specific UW-Whitewater general education courses:

Bachelor of Business Administration

Students at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater may declare a business major at any point in their studies, including their freshman year. Any student who meets the admission requirements is admitted to the College of Business and Economics. No separate application is required.

Admission

The minimum combined GPA requirement varies depending on the number of credits you have earned. In order to declare a business major, the following minimum requirements must be met:

- Less than 24 credits = 2.0 combined GPA
- 24 to 72 credits = 2.5 combined GPA
- 73+ credits = 2.8 combined GPA

**Transfer students are able to transfer up to 72 credits from all two-year institutions attended; students transferring in over 72 credits may exceed 120 credits needed for graduation*

To progress towards completion of a business degree, students must have a minimum combined GPA of a 2.5 to register for the lower division, or 200-level, business courses.

To register for the upper division, 300- and 400-level business courses, students must complete the following:

- 54 or more projected credits. Projected credits are the number of credits that will be earned at the end of the present term.
- A combined cumulative grade point average of 2.80 or better on a 4.0 scale.
 - Note: If your grade point average does not meet the above requirement, don't hesitate to contact the UW-Whitewater academic adviser in Advising and Career Services at 262-472-4900.
- Have finished or registered for the last unique and lower division business courses required for admission.

Additional BBA Transfer Information

All College of Business and Economics grade point average requirements refer to a "combined cumulative" GPA. This GPA computation includes your transfer credits and grades along with your UW-Whitewater credits and grades. This policy means that your transfer record contributes to determining whether you're eligible for lower division freshman- and sophomore-level business courses (2.50 requirement), admission to the college junior- and senior-level courses (2.80 requirement), and for graduation (2.50 requirement).

Your university degree requirements core courses may be personalized based on the number of credits you transfer. Be sure upon transfer to register for only the core courses required for you.

Regardless of the number of core courses you are required to take, you must meet the university (general education) requirements minimum of 32 units/credits and take the minimum in each area of university (general education) requirements. Your transfer institution may offer courses in a sequence that differs from the UW-Whitewater offerings. The most common examples of this discrepancy are in mathematics and economics. At UW-Whitewater, you will be required to complete finite mathematics unless you transfer in 8 or more credits of calculus. UW-Whitewater also requires courses in both macroeconomics and microeconomics. If you completed microeconomics, you will still need to take macroeconomics, and vice versa.

The Elementary Education program at UW-Whitewater leads to Wisconsin licensure “Middle Childhood through Early Adolescence” (MC-EA) for teaching students ages 6-12 or 13, or corresponding grades 1-8. Students completing this program receive regular education licensure from the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction to teach:

- Grades 1-8: all subjects in a self-contained elementary school
- Grades 7-8: language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, health and/or licensable minor subject in a departmentalized middle school
- Grade 9: Licensable minor subject in a departmentalized middle school

The College of Education and Professional Studies is approved by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.

For students who wish to return to Illinois to teach, please note that specific requirements for teaching licensure vary with each individual state in the US. Each state’s licensing agency sets requirements. For Illinois requirements, please reference the following website:

Admission

Students must be admitted to the University and then apply for formal Admission to Professional Education through the College of Education and Professional Studies (typically transfer students’ first semester on campus) in order to take upper-level education courses. Admission to the University does not guarantee admission to Professional Education.

Application Deadline

- University (transfer priority deadlines) – Fall (July 1st), Spring (December 1st)
- [Admission to Professional Education](#) (College of Education and Professional Studies)

- The Elementary Education program only admits twice a year in fall and spring semesters. In order to apply for admission to Professional Education, students must meet eligibility requirements listed below. **It is **strongly** recommended to meet the requirements prior to or soon after transferring to UW-W, specifically the GPA and test requirements as they are prerequisites to enroll in the Foundations Block courses at UW-W.*

Basic Eligibility Requirements for Admission to Professional Education

- Minimum combined cumulative GPA of 2.75 (all transferable credits earned from a regionally accredited institution)

OR

- Meet Wisconsin passing scores on all parts of the PPST (Praxis I) and/or Praxis CORE, ACT, SAT, or GRE. **It is very important to reference test details:** <https://www.uww.edu/coeps/advising-licensure#licensure>
- Minimum of 40 completed (transferable) credits at time of application with ENG151, ENG152, and SPE151 completed with a C or better or in process at time of application.
- Pass the Phase 2 portfolio evaluation at UW-Whitewater (while taking EDFNDPRC 210) (Please note: If EDFNDPRC 210 is transferred from another institution, then the 1-credit EDFOUND 214 Portfolio Development I course must be completed at UW-W)
- Achieve a C grade or better (or be currently enrolled) in each of the following three Foundations Block courses:

Additional Information

- **Criminal Background Check** – A criminal background check is required prior to allowing university students to volunteer or to complete experiences required in their programs (e.g., field work, student teaching, practicum, internship). A record may preclude you from participating in mandatory field experiences, disqualify you for a license, or service/employment in your chosen field.
- **Minor requirement** – A minor is required for the Elementary Education major: ESL/Bilingual, adaptive education, library/media, mathematics, general science, social studies, English, world language. Seek advice from the College of Education and Professional Studies at UW-W on this guide for minor recommendations and applicable coursework.
- **Maximum hours accepted from a community college** – Up to 72 credits may be transferred from a community college toward the minimum of 120 credits required for graduation. While additional credits may transfer, and satisfy requirements, they will be excluded from the overall 120 minimum for graduation.
- **Catalog year** – Students are responsible for meeting all degree requirements in effect at UW-Whitewater at the time they declare their UWW major, unless they interrupt their attendance at UW-W by an absence of four or more consecutive academic terms (including summer), in which case upon re-entry they will be subject to the requirements in effect at that time. However, please note that teacher licensure programs also follow state guidelines and policies which take precedence over the catalog year.
- **Course Repeat Policy, Calculation for Admission GPA** – Grades for all MCC transferable coursework attempted is calculated into the admission GPA. Remedial courses in math and English are also calculated in the transfer GPA. For repeat coursework, a course in which a grade of C- or below was originally earned may be repeated once. Only the grade and credits earned in the second attempt of a course repeat (even if lower than the first attempt) will replace those earned in the initial attempt when calculating grade point average and credits toward degree. This repeat policy is used in recalculating GPA for admission purposes.
